
JOSHUA KIMMICH

ELVIRA BACH

Elvira Bach is a German painter, graphic artist and sculptor, born in 1951 in Neuhain im Taunus, Germany, with her twin sister during the strawberry harvest season. In 1967 she attended the State Glass school and in 1972 decided to move to Berlin to study at the University of the Arts in Berlin. The strawberry harvest shows an important time in her life, which impacted her immensely and thus the theme of the strawberry harvest time is often reflected in her artworks.

In the 1980s, she was among the most outstanding protagonists of the Neo-Expressionist movement. Her international breakthrough came with her participation in the documenta VII. Elvira Bach has had her head on what she wanted to paint from an early stage and

stayed true to herself, the themes of her life and many of her works unmistakably resemble the artist herself. Painting strong, tall, erotic and confident women, which has become her life theme. Her visual language is powerful and energetic, and her works are characterised by strong colours and angular forms. Elvira Bach was gratefully celebrated as a female "Junge Wilde" and she met the expectations, which turned out to be a trademark, she became a narcissist idol.

Her works can currently be seen at the MOMA in New York, Vancouver Art Gallery and at the Museum of Art in Augsburg.

PAUL SCHRADER

Like the universe, the work "Galaxy" is centred in my imagination and runs along the edges in finest detail. Where the exact end of the universe takes place or whether it continues into all infinity is beyond my imagination. The work essentially consists of two basic colours, which multiply into many shades.

The application of the paint is partly fragile and vulnerable and thus reminds of the transient nature of time. In this way, the two essential elements of space and time are composed on the canvas to form a complex work.

The theme of the German artist Paul Schrader, who was born in Hamburg, is the breakout. This theme extends like an arc over all his works. Paul found his way to painting early, but instead of studying his beloved art, he studied law, wrote his dissertation in American and European antitrust law and worked for over six years in a major British law firm.

But his love of art remained the same as in his youth. And in order to break out of the everyday life of a lawyer, he created the world of art in which there are no boundaries. Abstract painting has always known no right and no wrong, it is much more intuition and freedom from schemata and thus the exact opposite of everyday office life, which is so typical for his generation.

Intense colours and their composition on the canvas determine the work of Paul Schrader. The application of colour is dynamically applied to the canvas, in some cases the colours seem to float. Although the moment of movement has long since passed, the motion continues into the present. Looking closer, the fine nuances of colour merge with delicate tones. Splashes of colour, which appear on the canvas like faded flowers and open new perspectives for the viewer. This breakout, the explosion of colours and freedom is not just to be found in Paul Schrader's art works; after more than six years at the law firm, he quit to devote himself entirely to art and to no longer be bound by borders.

Paul Schrader inverts figurative painting completely into the abstract and at the same time there remain empty spaces, precisely these spaces fascinate the artist. His art is above all concerned with the visual power of the pictures, which touch the viewer through their composition and become a feeling.

Manuela Karin Knaut is a German freelance artist, born in 1970. She received her Master of Arts in Fine Arts from the University of the Witwatersrand, Johannesburg. In addition to a studio with a printing workshop in Braunschweig, she also maintains a studio in Johannesburg, South Africa.

The artist works in collaborations worldwide and has been able to look back on many national and international exhibitions since 1990, which she has realized in South Africa, Ghana, Switzerland, Denmark, England, Austria, and the USA. Her works can now be found in public and private collections worldwide.

Manuela Karin Knaut's paintings reflects the artist's enthusiasm for traveling, exploring unknown terrain, and inevitably associated with leaving her own comfort zone. The daily "mess" in the streets of Johannesburg, the life in the townships that seems unusually chaotic and unordered for German eyes, the colourful variety

in the narrow streets of Accra, the un-plastered, brittle walls, the graffiti of the street artists in Brooklyn, life and hustle and bustle at the most different ends of the world: It is the fragmentary, the imperfect and, in many places, makeshift that fascinates Manuela Knaut and allows it to flow into her imagery.

Knaut lives out this restlessness, this insatiable curiosity and thirst for adventure in her colour-intensive works and in her space-filling installations. Her pictures are balancing acts between colour, form and line, surface and space, abstraction and object, picture and writing. Individual areas of colour are applied with strong brushstrokes and finally reworked. Woven into the painterly process are defined objects of various kinds. Everyday objects of everyday use in the middle of life, which they linearly contoured or even depict over a large area, overpainted or partially exposed.

THIERRY NOIR

The French artist Thierry Noir, who is originally from Lyon, moved to Berlin in 1982. Thierry Noir lived close to the Berlin Wall and looked at it daily, until he decided to paint it in 1984.


Noir covered the Berlin Wall, more than three metres high, with bright, vivid colours, aiming not to embellish the wall but to demystify it. Noir's iconic, bright and seemingly innocent works painted on this deadly border symbolised a sole act of defiance and lone voice of freedom.

Painting on the wall was absolutely forbidden; it was built five metres beyond the official border, so the East-German Border Guards were able to arrest any person standing near it. Noir had to paint as quickly as possible, using the recipe of 'two ideas, three colours' as a celebration of the 'eternal youth'. Despite their bright colours and playful nature, the murals left a lingering sense of melancholy, as Noir says: "I did nothing but react to its sadness", an act of defiance and a lone voice of freedom. The paintings of Thierry Noir became a symbol of the new freedom after the reunification of Germany and the end of the Cold War.

His brightly coloured, cartoon life profiles of murals spread over Berlin, London, LA and Sydney, bringing colour and a story everywhere he paints.

Thierry Noir currently resides in Berlin, Germany, and still paints to warn about new borders.

FRANZISKA KLOTZ

The German artist, Franziska Klotz was born in 1979 in Dresden. Franziska Klotz studied painting at the Art Academy in Berlin-Weissensee. She was awarded the Max Ernst Scholarship of the City of Brühl and worked for more than six months as a fellow of the German Cultural Academy Tarabya in Istanbul at the invitation of the Goethe Institute in 2015 and 2018. Her works are exhibited worldwide, during the 4th International Biennale for Young Art in Moscow 2014, at the 56th October Salon in Belgrade 2016 and the Fanø Art Museum in Denmark 2017. In 2018, her works were exhibited as part of the presentation of fellowship holders of the Tarabya Cultural Academy at the Hamburger Bahnhof in Berlin. In 2019, the Cultural Forum Schorndorf dedicated the exhibition "Ölregen" to her.

Franziska Klotz paints landscapes, figures or structures that she observes in real life. The scrutiny of reality and existential questions of being are just as critical to her as the means of painting per se: Composition, colour, form and individual expression. Painting remains painting, and a painting is always more than just its motive. Her works therefore are always both: images of transitory objects

and people as well as the immortal motif of a work of art. For the artist, painting means experimenting with color, the juxtaposition of figuration and abstraction. In addition to brushes, spatulas or spray paint, she also uses her fingers to be more directly connected to the image and art.

The painting *Imker* shows two figures, swarmed by a multitude of coloured dots - two beekeepers in white protective clothing, surrounded by a swarm of buzzing bees. The figures have no set identity, covered and protected they interact with the natural world of the beehive only through their sterile barrier. Though there is the possibility of connection between our world and theirs, the distinction between us and them is clearly defined thought the stark contrasting red of the gloves and yellow of the neckerchief worn by the figures. All else blends between colour, marks and even the fingerprints left by the artist. We rely on the bees, and they on us, we coexist as we can in this fragile world lost in hints of adumbrated reality. What exists instead reminds us of a science fiction scene.

Theresa Kallrath is a German Swedish Artist, born in 1987. Her works consist of large format acrylic painting created with different tools.

Theresa Kallrath attended the art and culture school in Lund in Sweden, learned nude drawing in Bremen from Till Meier, studied painting at the Düsseldorf Art Academy and at the École nationale supérieure des beaux-arts de Paris in France. She graduated from the Düsseldorf Art Academy with professors Udo Dziersk, Herbert Brandl and Siegfried Anzinger. With a special recommendation from the Düsseldorf Art Academy, she was given a place at the École nationale supérieure des beaux-arts de Paris in France, where she studied with Professors

Dominique Figarella and Bernard Piffaretti. In February 2016, her thesis "La mer Opale" was stolen from an exhibition at the Düsseldorf Art Academy.

Theresa Kallrath's trademark is large-format, colour-intensive acrylic paintings, which she creates with various tools: brushes, scrapers, wooden slats, and her own hands serve as tools for the young artist. In the work of art "It started with a kiss", the focus is on the positive moods through the title and the colours used, in which she deliberately does without the "non-colour" black.

MARKUS LÜPERTZ

Markus Lüpertz is a German painter, graphic artist and sculptor, born in 1941, in Liberec, Czech Republic. He is one of the most well-known German contemporary artists and a representative of neo-expressionism. The painter and sculptor wanted to find a more emotional, performing form of painting in the 1960s, which stood out from the then dominant American pop art and abstract expressionism.

He is known for his expressively rendered paintings and sculptures, which often merge abstraction and representation. His career first gained traction in the early 1960s, and he was the head of the Düsseldorf Art Academy, one of Germany's most acclaimed art schools, for 22 years. In his work, Lüpertz combines references to popular culture, biblical and mythological themes and protagonists, and his country's history and culture, including the Nazi era. His series of paintings of military helmets and other wartime symbols caused controversy in the 1970s, initiating a fraught relationship between him and the viewing public. "You cannot understand the artist in his time, you can only love or hate him," Lüpertz has said.

Markus Lüpertz currently resides and works in Berlin, Karlsruhe, Düsseldorf and in Florence, Italy.

The artwork shows an anatomical human heart created with Bengel's self-developed collage technique. Based on a special adhesive, the artist applied gold leaf, black sand and white sand. This combination of materials leads to a unique haptic and aesthetics.
